True Vine Theological Seminary Fees

One time application fee: \$50

Undergraduate Fees:

Each class is worth 3 credit hours

Cost per class is \$150 for a 16-week semester. (Military rate: \$120 per class for 16-week semester). Note: classes are \$50 per credit hour, or a military reduced rate of \$40 per credit hour.

Summer semester classes are 8/9-week semesters and are worth 2 credit hours.

Graduation Fee: \$125 (due one semester before receiving any level of degree).

TVT Seminary payment plan (if needed)

Plan A – Full registration payment (nonrefundable) at enrollment (if not previously paid during another semester) plus/or \$25 per class. Fifty percent of balance is due by week seven. The remaining balance is due by week 14. (Example for one class: \$75 due at enrollment [if registration needs to be paid, just \$25 if enrollment for the year is paid]; then \$62.50 due by week seven, and another \$62.50 due by week 14.)

Plan B – Full registration payment (nonrefundable) at enrollment, (if not previously paid during another semester) plus /or \$25 per class. One-third of balance due by fifth week of class. Another one-third of balance due by 10th week of class. Remaining balance due by 15th week of class. (Example for one class: \$75 due at enrollment [if registration needs to be paid, just \$25 if enrollment for the year is paid]; then \$41.50 due by week five, and another \$41.50 due by week 10, and the remaining balance of \$42.)

Book fees: Book fees are based upon the purchase price of the authorized book for the course. Students will purchase books through their choice of vendors available online on in stores.

PURPOSE OF THE STUDENT HANDBOOK

At TVT Seminary, we seek to develop an intentional Christian community of Kingdom-minded, Jesus-focused men and women who are committed to demonstrating biblical qualities of honor, unity, peace, grace, and integrity in all we do (1 Timothy 4:12-16). To support such health within our community, TVT Seminary maintains certain standards, policies, and procedures, which are provided in this Student Handbook and serve to develop a culture in which students can grow in maturity, wisdom, and knowledge. Our standards reflect our biblical beliefs. Enrolled students have voluntarily agreed to be a part of this accountable community. As such, all students are responsible for knowing and abiding by the standards in this Student Handbook, which serves as a covenant between members of our Seminary community.

HANDBOOK REVISIONS

TVT Seminary reserves the right to modify or cancel any statement, policy, or practice in this Handbook at any time, however communicated, and such changes may not be immediately reflected in this publication.

ACADEMIC ADVISORS

Each student is assigned as an Academic Advisor at the time of registration. Academic Advisors assist students in planning a course of study for each semester. Advisors should be consulted with all questions regarding schedule changes, program requirements, adding/dropping a class, etc. Students are encouraged to initiate connections and work closely with their Advisors to ensure academic success.

ACADEMIC DISHONESTY

Academic dishonesty is any act that compromises the integrity of the educational process, including cheating, fabrication, and plagiarism. TVT Seminary considers any kind of dishonesty a serious violation of both biblical and seminary standards.

Penalties for academic dishonesty may be handled by the professor and in cooperation with the Academic Dean. Dishonesty can have implications in grading, graduation, and continued enrollment. Once a student has been disciplined, if the student desires, an appeal may be requested before the President of the Seminary.

ACADEMIC PROBATION

Students who fail to meet the minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50 will be placed on academic probation.

Students who fail to achieve the required academic standards over a period of two consecutive semesters will be asked to withdraw for a minimum of one semester before they will be allowed to continue in their academic program.

ATTENDANCE

Students cannot miss more than four classes during a 16-week semester; however, individual professors are free to adjust attendance standards, and class expectations will be defined in the syllabus for each course.

CHILD CARE

TVT Seminary does not provide childcare for on campus courses. Underage children are not allowed to sit in the class. Please arrange to have someone watch your kids if you are attending on-campus.

FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITIES

All tuition fees, room/board charges are due and payable at registration. Students without sufficient funds may request a deferred payment plan; however, a portion of the balance, as determined by Student Accounts, must be paid by the first day of classes. Subsequent payments are due on the dates designated by Student Accounts for the student's payment plan. Students cannot attend classes without either paying their balance or setting up a payment plan. A fee is added to the student's account for deferred payment plans. Students are expected to make payments on time and pay all fees. Those who fail to do so may be suspended from school.

STUDENT ACCOUNTS

The Student Accounts Office oversees the billing and receipt of payment for tuition, fees, campus housing, meal plans, etc. A summary of related information is provided below. Please consult with the Student Accounts office for further info.

TRANSFERABILITY OF CREDITS

Credits earned at another educational institution may be accepted by True Vine Theological Seminary. Students will obtain confirmation from TVTS when and if credits you have earned at another institution are transferable. It is highly recommended to make certain that you know the transfer credit policy of True Vine Theological Seminary. You must have earned credit in courses in which you have received a C (2.0 on a scale of 4.0) or higher. You may transfer up to 45 credits.

UNPAID BALANCES

After the last day of classes, any student with an unpaid balance on their Student Account may be ineligible to register for a future semester. All students in such situations should immediately consult with the Student Accounts Manager for options.
